

FRANK STILL IMPROVING.

Prison Authorities Shocked by Another Convict Stabbing Case.

MILLEDGEVILLE, Ga., July 22.—With Leo M. Frank steadily improving and now believed to be practically out of danger, the State prison authorities were shocked today when another cutting affray took place. Charles Miller, a convict from Atlanta, was stabbed across the abdomen by Frank Reid, a lifer from Columbus, the town from which Frank's assailant came. It is rumored that the assault resulted from a quarrel over the Frank case.

When Governor Harris and the State prison authorities begin their investigation Saturday of the attack on Frank, Warden Smith will urge the installation of cells and a special ward for the insane. The Warden believes Frank's assailant is insane.

Monkey House Annoyer Sentenced.

Charged with accosting women in the monkey house and elephant houses in Central Park last Sunday, Peter Parino, 30 years old, of 221 West Twenty-seventh Street, was sent to the Workhouse for three months by Magistrate McQuade in Yorkville Court yesterday. Parino's wife was in court when sentenced was pronounced.
