

of Moses Frank, wealthy Atlantan, which has just been filed for probate. Among those to whom special bequests were left are:

Mrs. Marion Frank Stern, a niece, of Brooklyn, who is to receive \$70,000 in cash, while her children, Eleanor, Robert and Marjorie Stern, are to get \$1,500 each; Mrs. Ray Frank of Brooklyn, a sister-in-law, is to get \$10,000 in cash, and a nephew, Max Frank, of New York, receives the same amount.

The sum of \$16,000 is to be divided among several distant relatives at Dusdelsheim, Hesse-Darmstadt, Germany. Mr. Frank also left \$1,000 to the Hebrew Congregation and \$1,000 to the Lutheran Congregation in this town, which was his birthplace.

The bulk of his estate, which was comprised largely of cotton oil firm stocks, was left to his widow. A number of charitable bequests were also included in his will. The sum of \$1,500 was willed to his valet.
